



FMO REPORT MAY 2024

FMO Membership: The application form can be found at FMO.org or in the Clubhouse foyer under the glass case. Cost is one year for \$30 or three years for \$75.

As there are no legislative updates at this time, I am going to pass on some Fire Prevention tidbits for everyone's home from a recent seminar I attended. After viewing photos of a fire that totally destroyed a mobile home in less than 10 minutes, I feel it is even more important that we, as mobile home owners, are aware.

The Six Leading Causes of House Fires: Cooking, Heating Equipment, Electrical, Candles, Smoking and Christmas trees, in that order.

1. COOKING

- · Keep lids nearby to smother fires.
- Keep oven doors closed.
- Keep combustibles at least 30 inches away from heat sources.
- Put handles to the side or to the back to avoid being upended.
- Use timers in the kitchen to avoid forgetting about something cooking.
- Pets on counters may cause a fire.
- Clean up after use.
- DO NOT throw water on a grease fire as it causes it to projectile out of the pan/pot and spread fire elsewhere very quickly.

2. HEATING EQUIPMENT

- TURN OFF before bed and if leaving home.
- Make sure heaters have a tilt switch which will turn it off if it tips over.
- · Keep combustibles three feet away from heaters.

3. ELECTRICAL

- DO NOT use small gauge extension cords. Always check acceptable amperage of the cord for the item.
- Avoid extension cords and use power bars instead.
- · Turn off appliances when not in use.
- Remove all plugins when empty as they continue to heat up!
- Only use UL listed electric fireplaces as they are safe.
- Self-cleaning ovens get very hot; let the cycle finish and the oven cool off.

4. CANDLES

- NEVER leave unattended.
- Trim wicks to 1/4 inch.
- Keep 12 inches away from combustibles.
- Keep away from curtains, blankets, children, pets, etc.
- Avoid burning down low.
- Make sure it is secure and the base is strong enough to hold it sturdy.
- Do not remove hot clothes from a clothes dryer and leave them piled up as they are very combustible. Let

the dryer cool down and separate clothes.

5. SMOKING

- NEVER smoke while using oxygen.
- Smoke outside.
- Never smoke in bed, while tired or drowsy from medicine.
- Use noncombustible ashtrays and put butts out in sand or water.

6. CHRISTMAS TREES

- · Live trees must be kept well-watered.
- Sap is super flammable.
- Keep away from heat/ignition sources, doorways and exits.
- Do not use old lights as the bulbs get too hot.
- Make sure artificial trees are fire resistant.

Smoke Alarms:

- Should be placed in every room including bedrooms, hallways and attics.
- In the kitchen it should be 10 feet from the cooking areas and a minimum of 5 inches and maximum of 12 inches from the ceiling.
- · Test once a month; change batteries once a year.
- Smoke is the killer as it has CO2 in it and incapacitates people.

Also:

- Acid-lead and lithium batteries can explode as they draw a lot of power. These fires are hard to extinguish and often cannot be put out.
- Hand sanitizers contain a lot of alcohol which is very flammable. Be sure to keep away from any heat source. Alcohol burns clear so the flames are not visible and therefore a fire would not be detected easily.
- The fire department recommends the use of a fire extinguisher as opposed to a fire blanket. It coats the source and stops the fire. If a blanket is thrown on a grease fire, for example, there is a good chance that it would spread.

 In Lakeland, the fire department gets 27,000 calls per day. There are more calls on the North side as it is more densely populated.

Enjoy your summer everyone. If I have any news, I will keep you posted. See you all back here in December.

who is now a Happy Reader! It has been fun meeting neighbors, plus getting us to read books outside of our comfort zone!






