# News From Our HOA Treasurer Jan Danner

The dog days of August are upon us once again. As Buster Poindexter once sang, 'It's Hot, Hot, Hot". Hope everyone is coping. with the heat and rain.

I've had several people ask me to explain how our budgeting process works so I'll go over it Our budget is a calendar year -from Jan to Dec. We are well into 2014 so the figures I'm going to quote are for 2015. Our budget consists of over 40 categories from pool supplies to mail boxes. The biggest category, of course, is salaries at \$360k and in descending order, reserves \$275k, mowing \$200k, security \$140k, electricity \$90k and Those six categories insurance \$77k. consume over \$1.14 Million .Our total budget for 2015 is ,preliminarily, \$1.9 Million dollars. So the other \$760k is eaten up with landscaping, taxes, legal fees, office expenses, etc. A complete list is available from me, any board member, Gary Beeler or Randy Browning. The budget is finalized in August and then submitted to the residents for their approval in September.

Now, how do we fund these expenses? Us, of course, through our monthly maintenance fees and rental income. That provides the bulk but we also collect interest charges for those who want to finance their purchase of a share. Since the rental income goes down every year because we sell a share we're trying to develop some other sources of income.

We're going to start offering our seasonal renters the option of buying a bar code for their car. A price hasn't yet been determined but will be in place by Sept 1. Another exciting source of income is Amazon.com. By clicking on the Amazon button on our webpage, *LACASAROC.COM*, a portion of your purchase price is credited to us.

You must be registered on the website in order for us to collect. Please register so we can collect our share. It's doesn't sound like much but in June but we collected \$40 on just a few purchases. We anticipate that once the program is rolled out it could lead to several thousand dollars a year without any cost to us.

As Adlai Stevenson once said "a billion here, a billion there and pretty soon you're talking real money". While La Casa doesn't have quite that much you get the drift-manage your money in a responsible manner and let your money take care of you. Till next month.

The island has 9 miles of beautiful white, soft sandy beaches with acres of pine forests and spectacular displays of bird life. 


# Top Ten Facts About Ice Cream (From the Internet)


Do you love ice cream? So do I. Here are ten things you never knew about...ice cream.

We've had a great summer watching World Cup. We watch futbol (soccer) on a regular basis so this has been wonderful.

These days people are crazy for all kinds of sports so I wondered when all this started. In the Americas in the 17<sup>th</sup> century, early settlers were pretty busy and had little time or equipment for sports. The young people did play games so here are some of the most popular:

Blind Man's Bluff was played with 4 – 12 players. I remember playing this game as a kid.

Hunt the Slipper was played with 6 – 18 players. It reminds me of button, button that we played only this one uses a slipper.

Blow Out and Ring Taw were marble games. I didn't play with marbles so I don't know if they were anything like the marble games played when I was young.

Lacrosse was a game played by Native Americans who loved competition of all kinds. My niece plays Lacrosse for her college team in Minnesota. They travel a lot because not too many colleges play Lacrosse. She loves the game.



#### USTA RULES REVIEW:

#### WARM-UP

- 3. Warm-up is not practice. A player should provide the opponent a warm-up of five to ten minutes. If a player declines to warm up the opponent, the player forfeits the right to a warm-up, and the opponent may warm up with another person. Some players confuse warm-up and practice. Each player should try to hit shots directly to the opponent. (If partners want to warm each other up while their opponents are warming up, they may do so.)
- 4. Warm-up serves are taken before first serve of match. A player should take all warm-up serves before the first serve of a match. A player who returns serves should return them at a moderate pace in a manner that does not disrupt the server.

#### MAKING CALLS

- 5. *Player makes calls on own side of net*. A player calls all shots landing on, or aimed at, the player's side of the net.
- 6. Opponent gets benefit of doubt. When a match is played without officials, the players are responsible for making decisions, particularly for line calls. There is a subtle difference between player decisions and those of an on-court official. An official impartially resolves a problem involving a call, whereas a player is guided by the principle that any doubt must be resolved in favor of an opponent. A player in attempting to be scrupulously honest on line calls frequently will keep a ball in play that might have been out or that the player discovers too late was out. Even so, the game is much better played this way.






