2026 UPDATE

September 2026 is here, and while summer is almost over, the heat and humidity are still with us. Before long, our snowbirds will begin returning, and community activities will start picking up again.

Summer Improvements and Challenges

This summer brought several important changes and a few unexpected challenges around the community:

- Part of Palm Boulevard and the Clubhouse parking lot were repaved.
- The swimming pool received new pumps and electrical system upgrades.
- In July, a contractor on 301 cut our main water line, requiring residents to boil water or use bottled water for about a week. Fortunately, the office acted quickly, and the water line was repaired the same day.
- Murex donated a solar generator to CERT which would enable someone who needs power for a medical device to borrow it. Since it can recharge using solar cells it does not depend on house charging, gasoline or propane and can be placed inside.

Storm Season Reminder

Even though September has arrived, we cannot let our guard down. Florida remains in the heart of storm season, and September is historically one of the most active months for hurricanes. October can also bring significant storms, so it is important to stay prepared and continue monitoring weather updates.

Hopefully, we will avoid any major storms this year, but a little preparation now can make a big difference if severe weather develops. Remember the green (ok) and red (need help) papers to place in your window that CERT handed out a while backed .

9/11/2001

Twenty-five years ago, our country changed forever in a couple of hours. As passenger airplanes became weapons of war, we looked in horror while at home, at school, at work or on our way to work. I was unfortunately a spectator to what was unfolding in New York City. I was driving to a meeting in Brooklyn, across the East River from Manhattan. While driving I had heard on my radio

about the plane hitting the North Tower and figured it was a tragic accident. I entered an elevated section of the Brooklyn Queens Expressway (BQE) facing Manhattan and saw the second plane hit the South Tower.

All traffic stopped almost immediately. Police were on the scene instantly and for the next few hours everyone on the expressway was stopped with nowhere to go. I was fortunate to have a bag phone for work so I called the meeting telling them I wasn't going to make it. I then called my wife to tell her to turn on the TV. Several people then approached me and used my phone until the cell lines were no longer available.

We sat, no cars moving, and watched the South Tower fall and saw the fire and dust cloud. About 30 minutes later we watched the North Tower collapse. We looked on in disbelief and horror. My radio was on a local NYC station and I learned about the Pentagon and then Shanksville but we were all thinking about what was in front of us. How – who – why?

About 1pm (4 hours after the highway closure) the police opened the highway and allowed us to exit to local streets. For those of you familiar with the NYC area you

know that Queens and Brooklyn are really on the western end of Long Island. We could exit to local streets but no cars were allowed to exit Long Island, cross any bridge or tunnel north or west, until about 7 pm. Cars could enter but no one was leaving the island.

It was a very sad day for me. I only knew one person who worked in the North Tower. He was an administrator of the NY/NJ Port Authority. I can't imagine what those who knew people, had relatives, had friends, had family in the Towers went through that day.

For the next two months the Wall Street area, where the towers were located, was covered with dust of all kinds. Both the inside and outside of all of the buildings was dust covered. Traffic was checked and rechecked to get into the area. My job took me there often and it was a sad time for me for months.

It is now 25 years later and I am not sure how much meaning it has for people who were not directly impacted by it. Being an historian, I know that the history of the world, and for me, changed that day.

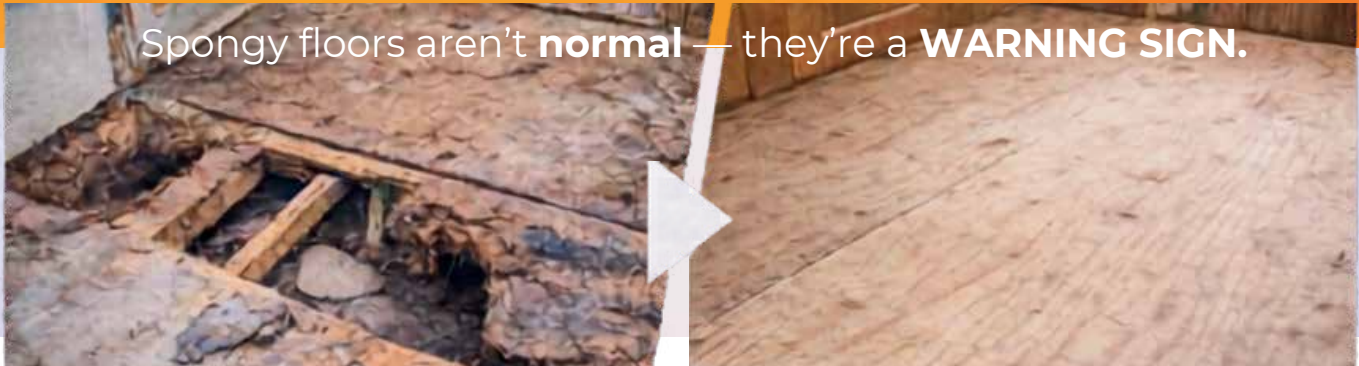

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BE CAREFUL OF PHONE APPS

You download an app, tap “allow,” and move on. It feels routine. But according to the FBI, that simple step may open the door to far more data collection than most people realize. In a recent alert from the Internet Crime Complaint Center, officials warned that many popular apps used in the U.S. are developed by foreign companies, especially those based in China.

- Some apps can keep gathering information even after you close them. That includes data across your entire device, not just inside the app itself.
- Default permissions can expose more than your own data. If you allow contact access, the app may collect names, phone numbers, email addresses and even physical addresses from your contacts list. That means your friends and family can be affected too.
- Many privacy policies confirm that user data may be stored on overseas servers, including in China, where local laws may allow government access, sometimes for as long as the developer chooses.
- Some apps may include hidden risks like malware. In worst-case scenarios, malicious code can exploit weaknesses in your phone, create backdoor access and pull in even more data without your knowledge.

You do not need a technical background to catch red flags. Start with these:

- The app asks for more access than it needs
- The privacy policy mentions overseas data storage
- Look for where your data is stored and how long it is kept.
- If there is no way to limit access, that is a warning sign.
- Stick to official app stores whenever possible.

You might think you are safe if you avoid certain apps. But that is not always true. If someone else uploads their contacts and your information is in their phone, your data can still be collected and stored.

- If an app does not truly need your contacts, remove that permission. This is one of the biggest data exposure risks.
- Let location to “while using,” restrict photo access and keep your microphone and camera off unless needed.

- Disable tracking features
- Security updates fix known vulnerabilities. Skipping them leaves the door open.
- Stick to official app stores
- Delete apps you no longer use
- If you notice unusual activity after installing an app, do not ignore it. That could include strange pop-ups, battery drain or unexpected logins. The FBI encourages people to report suspicious behavior through the Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) platform.

Apps make life easier. They help you navigate cities, stay in touch and manage daily tasks. But convenience often comes with a trade-off, and that trade-off is your data. The good news is you are not powerless. A few small changes can significantly reduce the amount of information your phone shares.



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PLAIN ENVELOPE SCAM

A plain envelope shows up in your mailbox. It is addressed to you. It may even have a tracking number. The sender's name looks unfamiliar, but the delivery seems real. Then you open it. Nothing is inside. No note. No product. No explanation.

That would make anyone curious and that is exactly what scammers are counting on. Investigators and consumer protection groups have warned that empty envelopes and mystery packages are tied to a scam known as brushing. In a more dangerous version, the package may include a QR code that sends you to a fake website or steals your personal information.

The bigger risk is what scammers hope you do next. If they can get you to scan a QR code, click a link, call a fake number or enter personal information, that strange envelope can turn into a much bigger problem.

A QR code is a hidden link. That QR code sends you to a fake website that asks for your name, phone number, address, credit card, bank login or shopping account password. It may also try to trick you into entering a one-time verification code.

That is where the real financial risk begins. If you give scammers your login details or banking information, they may be able to take over accounts, make purchases or access payment apps.

If an envelope or package arrives, and you did not order it, do not panic. Treat it as a warning sign and take a few smart steps.

- Do not scan any QR code
- Do not call mystery phone numbers
- Check your shopping accounts
- Turn on two-factor authentication
- Watch your bank and credit card statements
- Check your credit reports

Scanning a QR code does not always mean your accounts are compromised. But if you entered information, downloaded an app or typed in a verification code, act quickly.

- Close the browser window and stop using the site.
- Do not enter any more personal or financial

information.

- Change the password for any account you entered.
- Turn on two-factor authentication (2FA).
- Check your bank and credit card accounts for suspicious activity.
- Contact your bank if you entered payment information.
- Delete any app you installed from the QR code.
- If you entered your Social Security number, banking login or other sensitive information, consider freezing your credit.

IN PARK SCAM ALERT

Protect Yourself from Solicitors and Scams

The Garden has recently seen an increase in scam artists trying to take advantage of residents. If someone comes to your door offering to do work, such as painting, pressure washing, repairing car dents, or handling other small jobs, please do not agree to the work right away. If something seems to be too good to be true it most likely could be a scam.

What to Do if Someone Knocks

- Call the office before allowing any solicitor or contractor to begin work.
- Remember that this is a no-soliciting park.
- Consider using trusted residents or recommended handymen in the park, many of whom are dependable and do excellent work.

Need Help Reviewing Major Work?

If you are planning major work and want to know whether the cost is reasonable, please let TGHOA know. Many residents have valuable skills and experience, and we can help connect you with someone who may be able to offer guidance.

Look Out for One Another

Some residents have paid as much as 40% more for air conditioning work because they were misinformed by a seller. Please be cautious, ask questions, and reach out for help when needed. By looking out for one another, we can help protect our community from contractors who are only trying to make a quick buck on our residents.

Scammers count on you searching in a panic and calling whatever number an ad shows you. A list you trusted before the emergency is the antidote, especially for the parents and grandparents least likely to find these online.

All numbers are official government or designated national lines. Save the image; share the fridge copy.

The 6 Things to Gather Before You Switch Phone Carriers

Your old carrier controls the information your new one needs. Collect all six before you buy the new plan, not after.

The one on file, not where you live now

Month and year the account started

START BEFORE YOUR CYCLE ENDS

Clark Howard's rule: allow four days moving between major carriers, and closer to **10 days between two MVNOs**, where ports stall most often.

The trap: a wrong account number is the top cause of a bounced port, and MVNOs often use one number for both billing and your line. Ask them which one they port with.

DO NOT SKIP THIS

Never cancel the old service yourself. Let the completed port close it, or the account shuts and the number goes with it.
