ESCHEATMENT

Be aware of “escheatment.” Escheatment is the legal, state-mandated process of transferring abandoned or unclaimed property, such as dormant bank accounts, uncashed checks, or securities, to state government custody after a specific period of inactivity.

If you, as the account holder, do not have owner-initiated activity in your financial account that is, activity you personally undertake, such as making a deposit, withdrawal, updating your information, or contacting the institution, etc. and think you can just collect interest, you put your account at risk for closure. Automatic interest postings do not count toward keeping the account active. Simply collecting interest without any owner-initiated interaction can lead to the account being classified as dormant.

If the institution believes the account is dormant, the institution is supposed to do due diligence and contact you (such as via a mailed letter) before escheating funds. If unable to make contact, the institution is then supposed to send the money to the state. Note that currently, escheated funds are held indefinitely for the owner to claim (usually via the state treasurer's unclaimed property office and website.) But they have to go through the state’s administrative process first.

Florida's escheatment process, governed by Chapters 716 and 733, involves transferring unclaimed or abandoned property (bank accounts, uncashed checks, safe deposit box contents) to the state's Division of Unclaimed Property after a, usually 5-year, dormancy period. Funds over \$500 are published in local, relevant newspapers. While the state takes possession to benefit the School Fund, owners or heirs can claim their assets indefinitely, as there is no statute of limitations.

TO CHECK OR NOT TO CHECK

Previous experience with electricity persuaded me to have a master electrician check my home. Most companies provide an inspection/revue and free estimate.

I knew that the electric line to my water heater was undersize. When I installed a new water heater a couple years ago, I discovered that the circuit breaker and the water heater disconnect were 30 amps each. However, the line was only capable of adequately handling 20 amps.; a potential fire in the making. I guess old water heaters required less amperage.

My house is 31 years old and I figured it was time to have the main circuit breaker in the pedestal outside of my house checked. Good thing I did because it could not be turned off and thus would not have tripped if there was a problem (mainly with AC unit). Luckily, they found a replacement for an obsolete breaker.

I have also thought many times about having a whole house surge protector installed. What is required on new homes wasn’t of course required 31 years ago. It is said that our homes are affected 20 times a day with some type of electrical issue from the ground or electric line. Unlike several years ago, today’s surge protectors come with a lifetime warranty. You can also have FPL install one and you will pay each month for life.

Thus, along with cleaning and replacing all of my old circuit breakers (real life expectancy 25 years) and reconditioning my electric panel, I feel a lot safer. I will also remember to turn the breakers off for 15 seconds and back on again at least once a year. I, like all of us I am sure, hate to spend money on something that may never be a problem and no one ever sees. Just like replacing my gray (polybutylene) pipe, I figure better safe than sorry.

LONELINESS

Data shows social isolation is as deadly as smoking 15 cigarettes a day and raises the risk of premature death by nearly 30%. Yet as a nation, we've done remarkably little to address it. A recent AARP survey found 40% of adults 45 and older feel lonely, up five points from just a few years ago.

The most cost-effective intervention for many patients isn't another medication or procedure, it's human connection. And that's something no government program can prescribe.

Pick up the phone and actually call someone

Don't wait for others to reach out. Ask how they're doing. If it goes well, make plans. Commit to at least one call a day. It sounds simple because it is.

Help someone who has it worse

Serve food at a shelter. You'll be surrounded by people working toward the same goal, and odds are you'll stick around afterward to maybe share a meal together.

Show up to your faith community

Churches, synagogues, mosques — they've been bringing people together for centuries. There's a reason it works. These institutions remain among the few spaces in American life designed specifically for communal gathering.

Practice gratitude deliberately

When you're lonely, you focus on what's missing. Fight back. Write down what you're grateful for.

Get off the couch

Improves mood, and gyms, walking groups and fitness classes put you in proximity to other people pursuing the same goal.

Stop saying no

Many people admit they turned down invitations. "I didn't feel like it." "I don't really know them." Just say yes. You can always leave early — but only if you show up first.

Value in-person connection over digital substitutes. Our phones have made us more connected than ever and lonelier than ever. That's not a paradox; it's a warning.

PASSWORDS

Passwords play a huge role in how you stay safe online. They protect your accounts, devices and money. Still, many people pick logins that criminals can guess in seconds. Many of us still rely on simple words, easy number strings and familiar keyboard patterns. These choices give attackers a quick path into countless accounts.

These are the 5 most common passwords in the USA this year: admin, password, 123456, 12345678, 123456789.

Weak logins/passwords remain a major problem because criminals rely on automated tools. These tools try simple words and common patterns first. When millions of people reuse the same easy passwords, attackers succeed fast. A single stolen login can expose your email, social accounts, bank information and more. Many attacks start this way. Once criminals get inside one account, they often try the same password on others.

1. Pick long passwords or short passphrases. Aim for at least 12 characters. Mix letters, numbers and special characters (@,!,*). Avoid patterns.
2. Use a unique password for each account. If one login gets hacked, the others are safe.
3. Check your old logins. Replace anything short, predictable or reused. Fresh passwords lower your risk.
4. Turn on MFA (multi-factor authentication) adds a second check before you log in. It is one of the easiest ways to block attackers. Make this a mobile phone number or another email address.

Make sure you write down ALL PASSWORDS (and user names). Also make sure you cross out old ones as you create new ones. If you date them, it makes locating the correct one in the future easier. Don't lose this information. Keep it secure.

POTS AND PANS (YOUR RECIPES WANTED)

GREEN BEAN & ARTICHOKE CASSEROLE

- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese, divided
- 32 ounces frozen green beans, partially thawed
- 12 ounces frozen artichoke hearts, partially thawed (or 2 cans)
- 2 1/2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 cup Italian seasoned breadcrumbs
- 1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil, plus more as needed

Heat oven to 400 degrees. Reserve 2 Tablespoons Parmesan cheese for topping and add remaining cheese to a large bowl. Add green beans, artichoke hearts, garlic powder, salt, pepper, breadcrumbs and olive oil to the bowl. Stir until well combined and mixture is well coated with olive oil. Add a little more oil if necessary to moisten the mixture. Transfer mixture to a baking dish. Bake in preheated oven 50-60 minutes, stirring halfway through. Top with reserved cheese the last 10 minutes of baking.

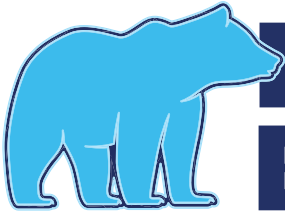
