AMC BRIEFS

The Association of Myakka Communities (AMC) is comprised of Harbor Cove, Harbor Isles, LaCasa, Lazy River Village, Village at Riverwalk. Representatives from each of these mobile home parks meet on a monthly basis. Each park has 2 – 4 volunteer residents attending the meetings.

The following is a summary of the topics discussed at the November 19, 2025 meeting.

Final plans for the annual AMC meeting February 18, 2026 in LaCasa starting at 10:30 am including speakers confirmed. Speakers are Sarasota Commissioner Ron Cutsinger; Alice White successful plants in Florida yards; Michael Rodrigue Fire Safety; Walter Breuggeman, Dept. of Florida Transportation. Each community will get poster information since this is open to the public.

AMC By-Laws were reviewed and changes will be voted upon in January.

Other topics covered included:

New permitting rules require a certain amount of vegetation to balance fresh/brackish pond water. Our ponds are too old to be under the new rules.

Questions about the cost of new bingo machines and pool temperatures were asked.

Clarification of what is required for accepting new residents. As long as the Community's Governing Documents are very specific with their requirements, issues should not arise.

Leaseholders

OBTAINING A SHARE

A number of residents have asked about what would be required if an existing 99-year leaseholder wanted to acquire a share and become member of the Resident Owned Community (ROC) and what would be the additional requirements and responsibilities. There seems to be some interest in the community for this and we would like your opinion on this matter.

As it stands currently, there is nothing in the Harbor Cove rules that directly addresses this. The current policy has been that a share could be purchased by anyone, such as renter or a 99-year leaseholder at the established share price. In the past there have been purchases of shares of ROC-owned properties in the past by renters, but not by 99-year leaseholders. The difference between renters and 99-year leaseholders is that renters have no ownership in a property, just tenant rights, but leaseholders own a leasehold interest in a property, which entitles them to ownership privileges and responsibilities for a set time period as set forth in the lease. In Harbor Cove most of the 99-year leases have about 40 years left on them. After the 40 years are up, ownership of the lot cedes to ROC.

If a person were to acquire a share, they would have full membership and would be able to vote on ROC matters and participate in any ROC Boards or committees. Fees would change as shown. Fees are as of January 1, 2026, pending ROC Board approval.

If a 99-year leaseholder were to acquire a share, the question becomes, "On what terms?" Should ROC charge for the share or do an "even swap", that is give up the 99-year lease in exchange for a share ownership? It is the opinion of some residents that an even swap, a lease traded for a share, would be of benefit the Community. There would be immediate improvement in the cash flow from the annual maintenance fee with long-term, positive benefits as well as more participation in ROC with new members joining.

This is an item that may be proposed in the coming months. A group has been discussing the pros and cons of this proposal and would love to have your input. We will be having a discussion of this after the open forum in January or you can email at hcadhoc12s@gmail.com



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
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BOCCE

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

confident they will continue to meet any needs for new assignments.

I will be taking renewed action on "derelict" items this year. I have to continue to do this unpopular exercise every couple of years when I see boats or campers not used. When I observe stored equipment unused, I investigate. Often a boat will not be used for some period of time due to a medical issue with the owner. Happily, some times in a few months or next season I see the boat being used again. This year I have my eye on 4 items that are unused, and slowly deteriorating. Those owners will be asked to sell or dispose of those items if there is no good reason for them to be aging in place.

If you get a new item, please request a new identification permit sticker. Each sticker bears an individual number that we record and use to identify who owns that equipment. You may notice all these stickers indicate "HC permit 2016" that was just the year we started using that numbering system and means nothing more than to identify the owner. Also don't forget to affix your current state registration stickers. Every year we are asked about numerous boats and trailers with expired state registrations. The vast majority when documents are checked in the office show they are current.

Please do not hesitate to ask for assistance if you have trouble getting into your space. Occasionally we have some equipment parked crooked or not within the assigned space and we can solve that problem for you. Don't take a chance causing damage to your own or your neighbors stored items.

Lastly, our committee always welcomes new members. This is a working committee that performs a needed service for the community. Assigning parking spaces, policing usage, keeping our facility clean and well maintained, reviewing and revising policy. We typically meet once a month and each member of the community is responsible for duty two weeks during high season. If you feel you would like to serve the community in this way, seek me out to apply. The compound phone number is unchanged 941-234-9062. If you need us call the cell during business hours. If the "duty officer" is not immediately available, please leave a message for a return call.






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
