Below are a few important reminders and updates for all residents:

Residents **must accompany their guests** to *all* community amenities—this includes the pool. We have recently witnessed younger guests using the pool without a resident present. **This is not permitted under community rules.** If guests are found using the pool without a resident, they will be asked to leave until an accompanying resident is present.

The brand-new ice machine has recently been clogged with paper towels and candy wrappers. Please help us keep it functioning properly: Use the **provided scoopers** at all times. Do **not** place trash or paper inside the machine. Your cooperation helps keep this amenity available and clean for everyone.

If a **private event** is taking place in the clubhouse, please respect the privacy of the resident hosting the event and refrain from entering during that time.

We've found the clubhouse door controls switched to the **"Off"** position after residents' finish bringing items inside. Please ensure that the button is left in the **"On"** position when you are done. This helps maintain proper access and function for all residents.

Any work performed on the **outside of your home** must be approved by management **before** the work begins. This ensures uniform appearance, safety, and compliance with community standards.

Anyone staying in your home for **more than 30 days** must be approved by management. Failure to do so may lead to additional consequences, so please notify us in advance if someone will be staying long-term.

Parking Reminder

Please note that **overnight street parking is not permitted.** Kindly ensure vehicles are parked in approved areas to allow emergency and service access. We continue to experience issues with vehicles parked in the street, blocking emergency access and limiting visibility for neighbors entering and exiting their driveways. Please remember: **No overnight street parking is allowed.** During the day, ensure your vehicle does **not** block driveways or restrict access for other residents and emergency personnel. Daytime parking should only be a short, limited amount of time.

Residents are reminded **not to use other homeowners' driveways to turn around.** Please use community streets for turning vehicles.

Important Wildlife & Pet Reminders

We would like to remind all residents that **feeding or watering wildlife—including cats—is strictly prohibited.**

Your block captains started collecting dues for 2026 after the HOA general meeting in December. If they have not seen you yet, get in touch with them or me. Dont miss out, and your membership will support **YOUR** HOA. Your membership will run from January to December of 2026 no matter what month you pay.

Everyone asks, what do I get when I join the HOA? Well, you get a board of 7 people who are working together, and who will stand up for you against management. This same board keeps management on their toes by making sure they are complying with any and all city codes and ordinances. For ONLY \$20 a year, you join **with** your community to support the board and all it's efforts to offer activities for everyone, **EVEN THE FREE ONES.** \$5 of that fee goes straight into the legal fund. Your membership also gives you a vote and voice at members meetings. If you rent a unit in this community and join the HOA, you are considered an Associate Member, and entitled to all the same benefits as members but with no voting rights and also may not run for the Board.

Remember that there is strength in numbers. If you have not yet joined, your block captain will be happy to come over and collect from you. Or, contact me and I will make it happen.

Your HOA has a fiduciary responsibility to its membership. Definition of fiduciary: *one who obligates himself or herself to act on behalf of another (as in managing money or property) and assumes a duty to act in good faith and with care, candor, and loyalty in fulfilling the obligation.*

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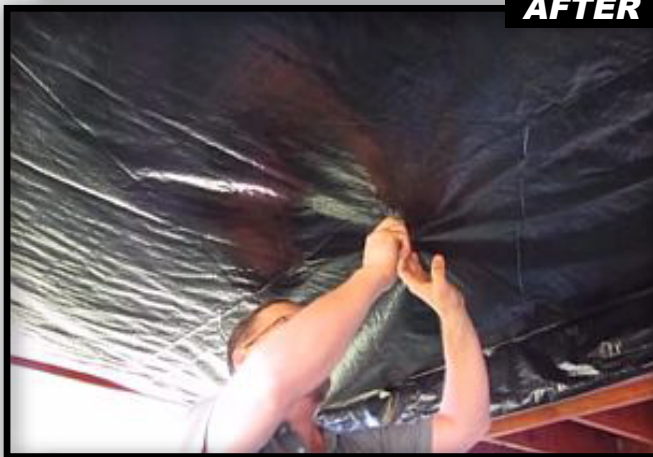
