INFORMATION ON COYOTES

With the amount of construction nearby, we are seeing more coyotes in the park. Here is some information about preventing coyote contact, as well as what to do if you do encounter one.

Do not feed coyotes

The number one most effective way to prevent coyote attacks in your neighborhood is to eliminate wildlife feeding. Coyotes that are fed in residential neighborhoods can lose their fear of people and may eventually attack humans (and pets).

Many people unintentionally feed coyotes by leaving pet food or garbage out at night or having large bird feeders. Coyotes are usually not interested in bird food, but bird feeders often attract rodents, especially squirrels, which then attract coyotes.

Make sure that compost piles and trash bins are not allowed to be a source of food. Although coyotes seem to have a natural inclination to avoid human-related food, this can change when prey populations are low, or if the coyotes are young and haven't yet learned to hunt effectively.

Bottom line: remove anything from your yard that might attract coyotes such as dirty grills, compost, pet food, birdseed, fallen fruit, trash and unsecured garbage cans.

Keeping Pets Safe

Pets left outside, even with fencing, remain at risk. Do not leave your pets unattended outside, not even for a second. Keep your pet on a non-retractable leash. Unfortunately, retractable leashes don't offer enough control if your animal runs into a coyote.

Be especially careful at dusk or dawn. Don't walk your pets at night or during twilight hours. If you do decide to walk them during these times, carry a flashlight and a noise maker.

You can outfit your pet with a coyote vest. This is a type of pet body armor designed to protect small dogs from attacks by predators like coyotes.

Coyote Encounters

- If you encounter a coyote, stay calm. Most importantly, do not turn your back on the animal and do not run.
- Make noise by shouting or clapping your hands.
- One recommendation is to carry some sort of noise maker with you like an air horn or a can

of rocks or coins and a flashlight.

- Make yourself look larger by standing tall and waving your hands overhead.
- Maintain eye contact and back away until you are a safe distance apart. Do not run, that is the worst thing you could do.
- The coyote may run away but then stop after a distance and look at you. It is important to continue to haze the coyote until he completely leaves the area.
- If you encounter a coyote while you are out with a small pet, pick up your pet (if you can) and hold it securely before starting these scare tactics.
- If you see a coyote during the daytime, be cautious, as that coyote may have become habituated to humans (and may be more likely to attack). The advice is the same: make noise, wave your arms, do not run away.
- Be extra alert during breeding season for coyotes. These animals have babies in April and are super protective of their children April through August.

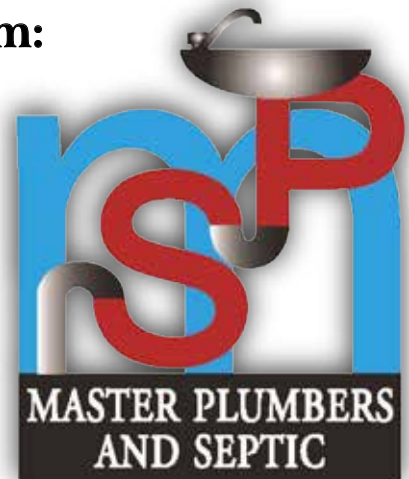

Daily specials:

Wednesday: \$1 Shrimp. Add 3 wings for \$4

Besides the daily specials, they offer lunch specials Monday-Friday until 2:00

Welcome to February Spanish Lakes! This month I am giving you my favorite Chicken dish to create a lovely Valentine's Day dinner. It is preservative free, easy to make for two or four, and it freezes well. Plus, it's all natural and high in protein.

CHICKEN MARSALA

Ingredients

4 boneless skinless chicken breasts

1/2-3/4 cup flour

1/2 stick butter

1/4 cup olive oil

1 cup sliced white mushrooms

1 medium sliced onion

4 large, diced cloves of garlic

1/4 cup Marsala Wine

1/2 cup chicken broth

Salt and pepper to taste

Instructions

1. Pound the chicken into thin cutlet slices.
2. Coat the chicken well in the flour.
3. Heat the butter and oil in a large skillet on medium high heat.
4. Brown the chicken in the fat mixture 3-4 minutes on each side until it is golden. Remove from heat to another platter. If necessary, add a bit more butter if chicken sticks.
5. Reduce heat to medium and add mushrooms, onions, and garlic to the pan and sauté until tender.
6. Add chicken broth and wine, stir and add salt and pepper. Stir to make sauce.
7. Return chicken to pan and coat with sauce.
*At this point taste your sauce and adjust for flavor by adding more wine or seasonings. You can add a little garlic powder if you like a stronger garlic flavor.
8. When the onions, mushrooms and chicken are coated, the Marsala is ready to serve.

This dinner can be served with a nice White Wine, Angel hair pasta, a green vegetable, salad, and Strawberries with cream. Happy Valentine's Day!

- No Lifeguard on Duty. Swim at your own risk
- Shower before entering the pool.
- No food, glassware, or beverages allowed in the pool or fenced area. Commercially bottled water in plastic bottles are allowed in pool fenced area.
- Children not potty trained are not allowed in pool.
- **No diving or jumping** into the pool.
- No animals allowed in pool or pool fenced area.
- Pool capacity **16** persons.
- Persons under 16 may use pool between 11 AM – 3 PM and 5 PM – 7 PM with adult supervision.
- No smoking in the pool area.

POOL MAXIMUM DEPTH: 6 FEET

NO DIVING

1. Please put down the umbrellas and clean up all trash.
2. If you take down the rope to swim laps, please put it back after you are finished.
3. Please shower before going into the pool. Sand is accumulating and damaging the filters.



The pool is there to be enjoyed by all. Thank you for your respect of your neighbors and your Association.

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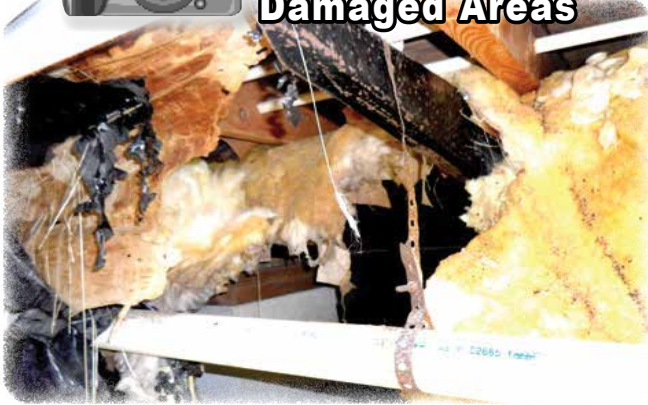
