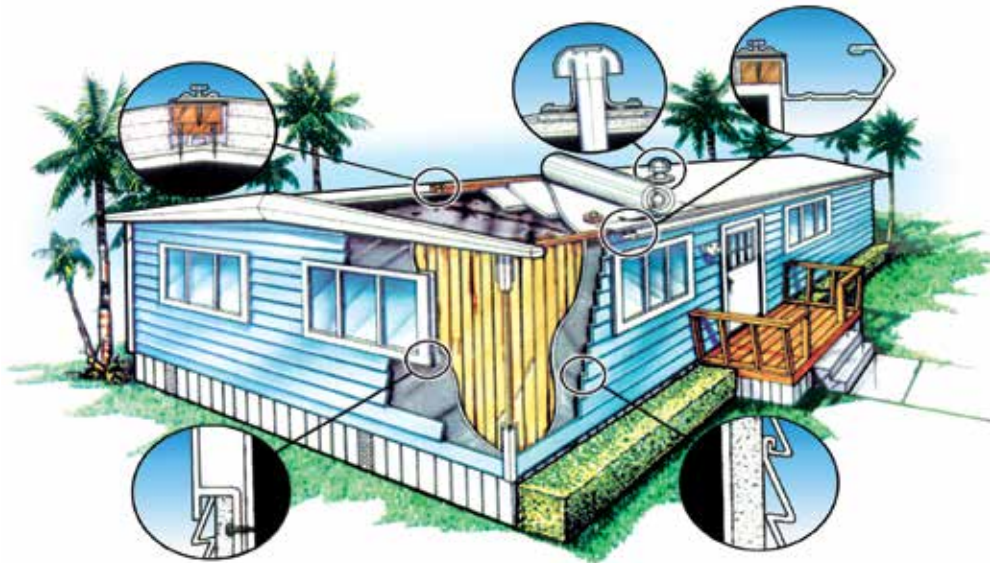

Owners: What **AGE** do I need to be in order to **RESIDE**, which means “live here” in Carriage Village?

According to our Carriage Village Landowner’s Association By-Laws, Article XI, Section 1, units must be occupied by at **least one (1) person 55 years of age or over**. And, under an amendment filed on March 19, 2021, Article XI, Section 3, **no person under the age of 40 years shall be permitted to permanently reside in the units**.



RENTERS: ALL Renters MUST BE 55 and have a lease on file for the period they will be renting, which can be **NO LESS than 90 days**. Anyone under 40 in their unit is considered a guest and must also follow all Carriage Village Rules, Regulations and By-Laws allowing them to stay for a period of no more than 3 weeks.

Reminder to OWNERS:

LESS THAN 90 days rental agreements are NOT PERMITTED
Rental agreements MUST be on file with the Office



CVLA Lawn and Yard Care

We want to keep Carriage Village beautiful ALL YEAR long!

CVLA would like to know who is doing your lawn and yard care when you are gone. Rocks need to be maintained, as well. This will assure us and your neighbors that your property is being cared for while you are away. And, we can inform you if your lawn and or yard company is not keeping up with your lawn and yard care.

There is a \$125.00 fee (each time) for overgrown lawn and yard maintenance if Carriage Village has to take care of the lawn and or yard.

Security KEY FOBs

Available at the Clubhouse during office hours

- One FREE FOB per Owner-Resident household
- 2nd FOB can be purchased for \$20
- Renter-Household FOB \$20 per renter (Each renter in a household must purchase a FOB)
- FOBS must be signed for by a household member. If you get a second FOB, the other household member must sign for the second FOB.
- Replacement Cost for any lost or damaged FOB is \$20
- FOBS are easy to attach to a lanyard or your key ring
- These FOBS are about the size of a quarter and they are NOT waterproof, so don't jump in the pool with a FOB in your pocket!

FOBS access the Clubhouse Doors, Pool Gates, and the Compound Gates. **Clubhouse and Pool and Compound will be locked at all times, so DON'T FORGET YOUR FOB!**

The Back Gate Exit "ARM" is sensor activated and will lift when a vehicle pulls up to it

NEW! FOBS are no longer deactivated when Snowbirds head North!



Safety at the Pool

Remember, there is **NO glass** allowed inside the fenced area of the pool which includes the pool deck, the pool itself, and the screen room.

NO GLASS at the pool is a Lee County Code Requirement!



Pool Wristbands

Carriage Village **REQUIRES** everyone at the pool to have a CVLA Wrist Band. You do not have to wear one, but you must have it handy at the pool.

- ORANGE = Owners
- GREEN = Renters
- YELLOW = Visitors
- PURPLE = Lee County Resident Family Visitor

Pick up the bands in the CVLA office.

Please remember to return your visitor's wristbands to the office when your guests have gone. Renters must have a lease verification on file in the office and bring their lease agreement with them. Please do not get offended if you are asked for your wrist bands. There are so many new residents, and we don't recognize everyone yet. We are protecting our pool by allowing only residents and their guests to enjoy what we are paying for.

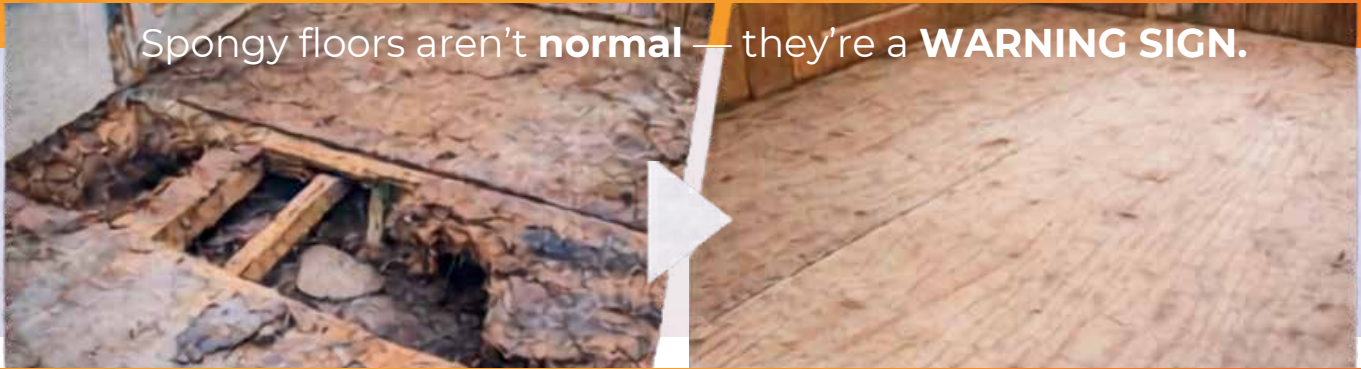

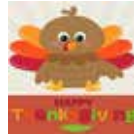

Should I evacuate if a hurricane comes this year?

The greatest threat to life from a hurricane is storm surge flooding. If you are in an ordered evacuation zone, low-lying flood area or in a mobile home, you should follow all evacuation orders. However, if you are not in an ordered evacuation zone, low-lying flood prone area, mobile home or unsafe structure, then it may be safer to stay in your home. **Always heed the advice and orders of local officials during a storm.**

Know your Zone: **North Fort Myers and CVLA are in ZONE B, however, Manufactured Homes fall into a ZONE A classification- first to evacuate.** If you do not evacuate, you are taking a very BIG risk. Evacuation Options: Shelters, family or friends that live a bit farther inland; hotels; or just drive inland and hunker down until the hurricane passes. Hurricanes don't just "pop-up" ... you should have plenty of time to make a "GO" plan and get out.

The guide is an overview of all things preparedness in Southwest Florida; Topics include: Knowing your Evacuation Zone, Prepping a Disaster Supply Kit & Finding ...

Things to stock up on and have plans for (this list is not all-inclusive): WATER (for 2 weeks); non-perishable food; ice or ice packs; pet supplies; first-aid kit; medicines; prescription meds; a communication plan to family and friends; what do you need to do to prep your home and batten down the hatches (roof, flying objects; is your drainage clear, etc); batteries; flashlights; tarps; gloves; ropes or tie-downs; trash bags; buckets; a radio; cell phone power cords or charged battery packs; a generator and gas to run the generator; extra gas cans that are full or can be filled; alternative cooking methods, like grills; heavy-duty extension cords for your generator; know your pet-friendly evac centers (you need a pet carrier), friends you could visit; pet-friendly hotels; disability needs accommodations; gas in your vehicle; emergency phone numbers (EMS, Insurance Company, FEMA, etc); you should have CASH on hand.

IF you have been through a hurricane, you know what to expect! If you have not enjoyed a hurricane disaster yet, you can expect: EXTENDED POWER OUTAGES; NO HOT WATER; LIMITED CELL SERVICE; Limited or no INTERNET; NOTHING is open for miles around; emotional and physical stress; think of it as living in a Third-World Country.

Pay attention to weather reports. Read the Hurricane Prep Guide.

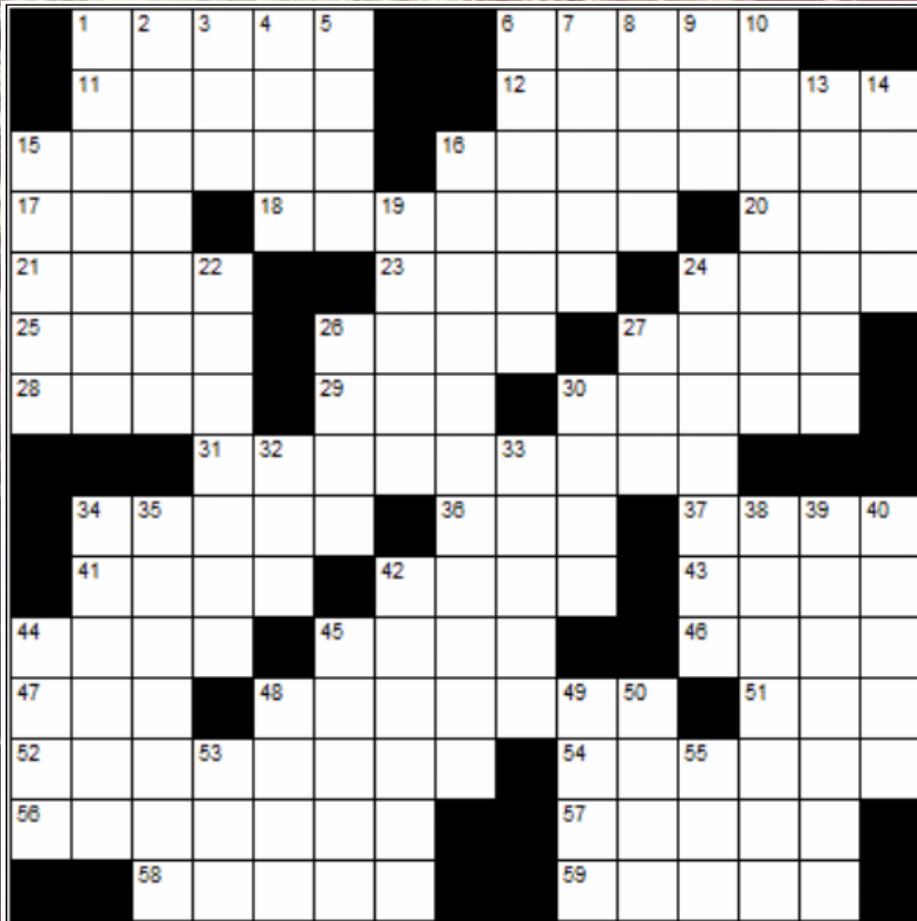

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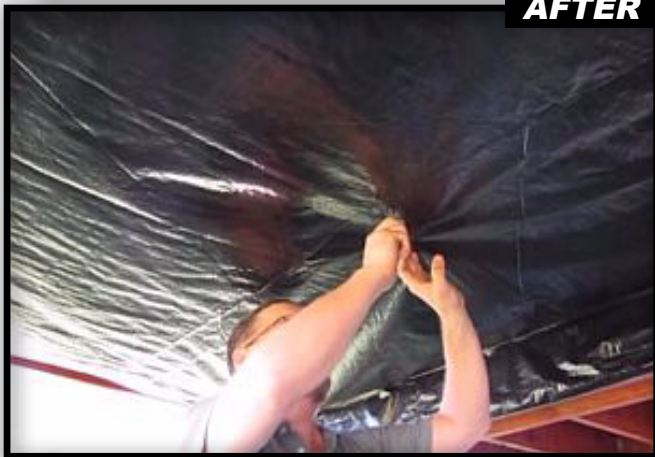
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
