Your Board has been busy during February preparing for the HOA Annual Meeting and consulting with our attorney regarding the Legal Fund Amendment to the HOA By-laws. Based on the attorney's guidance, a mailing was developed and sent to all who were Members in Good Standing at the end of January. The mailing included an explanatory cover letter, notice of meeting, proxy and the legal fund amendment language. A 30% quorum of Members in Good Standing was necessary to go forth with a vote. This message was prepared in early February, so there can be no report on the results of the Annual Meeting held February 24th at this time.

The Nomination Meeting was held in January, and we had two individuals volunteer to be Board members. Andy Harrell and Julia Greenwood were the only two to be considered with no other nominations. They will become Board Members at the February Annual Meeting to serve starting March 1, 2026.

## WHAT IF I OWE THE IRS?

First if you owe, of course, is to pay the balance of what you owe by check, debit card, credit card or automatic withdrawal from your bank. What happens if you haven't paid your taxes on time during the year or you don't pay your balance due by the due date of April 15? The government will charge you penalty and interest for every day late the payment is. Second to prevent owing taxes from re-occurring is to increase the amount of taxes you are having withheld from your wages, pension, IRA, or Social Security or make Estimated Payments throughout the year.

The third set up an Installment Agreement (IA) if you can't pay the amount due immediately. You may qualify for a self-service online payment plan. Once your online application is complete, you'll receive immediate notification of whether your payment plan has been approved without having to call or write to the IRS.

You can set up a Short-Term Installment Plan. You can request up to 180 days to pay the amount in full and incur no fees except for penalty and interests for late payment if the amount owed is less than \$100,000. You can set this up online or call the IRS.

A Long-Term Plan is if the payment period is longer than 120 days, paid in monthly payments, and the amount owed is less than \$50,000 in combined tax, penalties and interest and can be paid in ten years. If the IRS approves your long-term online payment plan (IA), a setup fee may apply depending on your income.

If you don't qualify for an online installment payment plan, you may also request an Agreement by submitting Form 9465 with the IRS. If the IRS approves your IA, a setup fee may apply depending on your income. There are two types of Long-Term Plans. One is a Guaranteed Installment Plan if you owe less than \$10,000 excluding interest and penalty and you have timely filed and paid all your taxes in the past 5 years, have had no other installment agreement in the past 5 years, agree to pay the full amount in 3 years and comply with all tax laws while in the agreement, and are financially unable to pay the balance in full at this time.

The second is a Simple Payment Plan if you owe less than \$50,000 and can pay the amount within 10 years from the date the tax was assessed. You decide what you can pay and the day of the month you will make the payment by check, direct debit, or payroll deduction.

A fourth alternative is to make an Offer in Compromise. An Offer in Compromise (OIC) is an agreement between you and the IRS that will resolve the amount you owe by payment of an agreed upon lesser amount. Before the IRS will consider an offer in compromise, you must have filed all tax returns and made all required estimated tax payments for the current year.

If you are in an open bankruptcy proceeding, you aren't eligible for an Offer In Compromise. You can use the online Offer in Compromise Pre-Qualifier tool to see if you are eligible for this agreement. Use of the tool does not guarantee offer acceptance.

The IRS usually accepts an Offer in Compromise (OIC) if paying the tax in full creates a financial hardship. They consider your ability to pay, your income and expense and your asset equity. The IRS generally approve OIC when the amount you offer represents the most they can expect to collect within a reasonable period of time. Explore all other payment options before you submit an Offer in Compromise. The Offer in Compromise Program is not for everyone. You should hire a tax professional to make your offer as they have specialized knowledge on how to use acceptable low values for your assets and an all-inclusive list of expenses.

If you can't pay anything at all in any amount of time, contact the IRS and ask about hardship. If you qualify for Currently Noncollectible Status, the IRS will not pursue any collections against you. However, they will monitor your account and resume collections if your finances improve. The IRS will also generally file a Federal Tax Lien in exchange for placing an account in Currently Not Collectible (CNC) status.

If you can never, or chose never, to pay your taxes, what can the IRS do? Depending on how much you owe and what prior collection actions the IRS has utilized, they may Levy (garnish) your wages, bank accounts, physical property, and retirement funds. This means they actually seize the property to pay the debt.

The IRS can put a Federal Tax Lien on your property—real estate, personal property and financial assets. A public lien can limit your ability to get credit. The Federal Tax Lien continues even if you file for bankruptcy. It secures the government's interest in your property.

The IRS may ask the U.S. State Department to revoke your passport or deny your application once you become seriously delinquent. The amount needed to be "seriously delinquent" changes each year to account for inflation. As of 2025, a taxpayer owing at least \$65,000 is considered seriously delinquent.

The IRS typically does not send people to jail for simply not paying taxes. Jail time is usually reserved for cases of tax evasion or fraud, which involve intentional wrongdoing. If you owe taxes, you must communicate with the IRS and use one of the options mentioned above to settle your outstanding debt.

The IRS collection efforts don't last forever. The Collection Statute Expiration Date, or CSED, is the end of the time when the IRS can continue to attempt to collect taxes. This is generally 10 years from the date of the assessment. These can be assessments from returns you've filed or amended, or assessments from Substitute for Return filings, and from audit. After that they can't collect the money from you.

Best advice is to pay in during the year so you don't owe.



## PARK PLACE CHAPTER 2

We ended last month at the end of 1987 when Hyatt resumed management of his community, now renamed Park Place. Dominic Federico had just agreed to purchase his home next to the bridge when the news of the default hit the papers. The seller contacted Dominic and told him not to worry, the park would be ok and the sale was completed.

Despite the bad publicity, which continued as Hyatt sold "shares" in park ownership that yielded nothing, it did not affect home sales in the park. Gwenn Freeman moved into the park and started writing a bi-weekly column for the Press Journal in August 1988. She reported 70 families here, and she chronicled their many activities - some still happening! PPHA was incorporated in February 1989 then the County extended sewer and water service to the park. To the delight of park owners - no more brown water with the county now providing utilities. By July 1989 the first picture and telephone directory was published, and 123 families called the park home!

Hyatt decided to move his model home center to a 9605 US 1 (near today's Gator Lumber) and in 1991 Peggy Schaefer came to work for Hyatt there. West Lakeview, which had no homes, began being developed. The long-planned Auditorium was being completed and opened in December 1992. Previously ALL social events took place in the clubhouse - today's card room, library, and entrance hall. The "craft room" was storage for party supplies plus office use. There was NO kitchen. Stratton Avenue, once a dead-end, disappeared a few years later, becoming Barber Street now making the big curve and extended to US 1. Unfortunately, now the site to be developed across from our entrance gate was no longer on a dead-end road, so development plans were scrapped. But Park Place was still growing, and the residents produced another phone and picture directory in 1993.

By 1994 the Phase 1 section of Park Place was mostly built out and Hyatt wanted to start developing Kelly Drive. Hyatt was always in need of money. Aside from offering lots for rent OR SALE, he needed more capital, so he sold Phase 1 to Stanley Garris, an out-of-state investor. Hyatt continued to be the developer, Garris was a silent partner - EXCEPT he read the Prospectus and realized there was more to be collected from the

tenants. While his court case to change the rent structure was unsuccessful, he did prevail with the property tax structure. Park Place's contribution was locked by the precedent set by Hyatt but the ad velorum and non-ad velorum fees were now divided among the Phase 1 homeowners. Undeterred, residents put out another picture and phone directory in 1995-1996.

For some reason, perhaps financial, Hyatt sold the Kelly Drive area he was developing to Primary Gen Par from Miami Florida in January 1998. The purchase, the title document was a mess and their brief period of ownership was not successful. But there were about a dozen unsold models which the owners instructed Peggy to sell and "mail the keys back to them," closing that period of "ownership." I say that in parenthesis because although Hyatt sold the park as he sometimes did, he held the mortgage, so he resumed ownership of Kelly Drive in 1999, again selling or renting lots for homesites.

Meanwhile for the residents of Park Place another change was coming. The PPHA held the purse strings and funding to the ladies, who organized the social events, was not always forthcoming. Since the social events provided most of the money to the treasury, the ladies decided to organize and run the social events as a separate entity. June 1, 1998, SCOPP (Social Committee of Park Place) was born, originally under the leadership of Betty Marlowe and the funding issues were over.

An even bigger event was on the horizon, although residents were initially unaware. The Turner family bought phase 1 from Garris (and Hyatt) in September 1999. Hyatt also sold off the undeveloped parts of the park to others, but he retained the Kelly Drive portion which, for a period of time, was a separate park. Eventually he sold that part to the Turner family, and another Chapter of Park Place was started. Eileen Derrick

Hi all, our new culinary adventure took us to Farm & Flame restaurant, located at 9320 90th Ave. Vero Beach or as some may know it as the Ye Old Davis Farms. It actually is on the line of Sebastian and Vero Beach, north of the Sebastian River High School off 510. Owners Brian and Pat Davis opened the restaurant in late 2025 but still operate the totally organic Ye Old Davis Farms. The restaurant has a rustic atmosphere offering a unique dining setting and features a diverse menu including Asian, sushi and land and sea options with a focus on fresh ingredients and highlighting a farm to table concept. It is open for lunch from 11:30 to 2:00 PM and dinner from 4:00 to 9:00 PM with seating inside and out. It also has a gorgeous large bar with ample seating and TVs for those who enjoy eating at the Bar

We were seated promptly, and our server MJ came to our table and explained the menu which was quite large and had many different options. We were given the lunch menu. Here are our choices; Appetizers; Fried Dumplings, shrimp, pork, vegetables, dumpling wrappers, 4 pieces for \$8.00. Sriracha Honey wings, 5 fried wings tossed with Sriracha sauce for \$9.00. Entrees, Farm Harvest Salad served with Focaccia bread Burrata cheese ball, baby dill pickles, cucumber crunchers, bell pepper, variety of dried fruit, pistachios, organic greens, raisins, candied pecans, pickled red onions, house made vinaigrette, and we added grilled chicken breast, \$26.00. This was huge and delicious. Red Dragon; roll tuna, shrimp tempura, avocado, cucumber, asparagus, tempura flake, spicy mayonnaise, teriyaki sauce and scallion for \$10.00. Pad Kra Pao basil stir fry, Thai basil, garlic, chili, onion bell pepper, basil sauce served with white rice for \$16.00. This was very spicy, but all was very good. Farm Philly, sourdough Focaccia bread shaved ribeye, queso blanco, shredded gruyere cheese, caramelized onion, peppers, and parsley served with fries for \$18.00. Garlic Pepper stir fry with beef, garlic, black pepper, onion, and garlic sauce served with rice for \$16.00. All were very good.

Rating our overall experience, we would definitely give this 4+; the food and atmosphere were excellent, but you do need to pack your patience. The food does take a while to come to the table as it is cooked fresh, and not all entrees come out at the same time. Just a couple of observations, the steaks are prepared over an open flame actually across from the restaurant.

And then there's the restrooms, they are located across from the restaurant, not sure how that will work out, rain will not be their friend. There also is a market across from the restaurant, but it is not open yet.

We would definitely say... give this restaurant a try, it seems to be a hit. Wishing everyone a Happy St. Patrick's Day and Happy Spring, see you next month.

**Saint Patrick's Day**, or the **Feast of Saint Patrick** (Irish: *Lá Fhéile Pádraig*, lit. 'the Day of the Festival of Patrick'), is a religious and cultural holiday held on 17 March, the traditional death date of Saint Patrick (c. 385 – c. 461), the foremost patron saint of Ireland.

Saint Patrick's Day was made an official Christian feast day in the early 17th century and is observed by the Catholic Church, the Anglican Communion (especially the Church of Ireland), the Eastern Orthodox Church, and the Lutheran Church. The day commemorates Saint Patrick and the arrival of Christianity in Ireland, and, by extension, celebrates the heritage and culture of the Irish in general. Celebrations generally involve public parades and festivals, céilíthe, and the wearing of green attire or shamrocks. Christians who belong to liturgical denominations also attend church services.<sup>[8][10]</sup> Historically, the Lenten restrictions on fasting and drinking alcohol were lifted for the day, which has encouraged the holiday's tradition of revelry.

Saint Patrick's Day is a public holiday in the Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland, the Canadian province of Newfoundland and Labrador (for provincial government employees), and the British Overseas Territory of Montserrat. It is also widely celebrated in places with a large Irish diaspora community, such as Great Britain, Canada, the United States, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa. Saint Patrick's Day is celebrated in more countries than any other national festival. Modern celebrations have been greatly influenced by those of the Irish diaspora, particularly those that developed in North America. However, there has been criticism of Saint Patrick's Day celebrations for having become too commercialized, for their connections to drinking culture, and for fostering negative stereotypes of the Irish people.

Saint Patrick was a 5th-century Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. Much of what is known about Saint Patrick comes from the Declaration, which was allegedly written by Patrick himself. It is believed that he was born in Roman Britain in the fourth century, into a wealthy Romano-British family. His father was a Christian deacon and his grandfather a priest. According to the Declaration, at the age of sixteen, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and taken as a slave to Gaelic Ireland. It says that he spent six years there working as a shepherd and that during this time he found God.

The Declaration says that God told Patrick to flee to the coast, where a ship would be waiting to take him home. After making his way home, Patrick went on to become a priest.

Present day Saint Patrick's Day celebrations have been greatly influenced by those that developed among the Irish diaspora, especially in North America. Until the late 20th century, Saint Patrick's Day was often a bigger celebration among the diaspora than it was in Ireland.

Celebrations generally involve public parades and festivals, Irish traditional music sessions (céilíthe), and the wearing of green attire or shamrocks. There are also formal gatherings such as banquets and dances, although these were more common in the past. Saint Patrick's Day parades began in North America in the 18th century but did not spread to Ireland until the 20th century. The participants generally include marching bands, the military, fire brigades, cultural organizations, charitable organizations, voluntary associations, youth groups, fraternities, and so on. However, over time, many of the parades have become more akin to a carnival. More effort is made to use the Irish language, especially in Ireland, where 1 March to St Patrick's Day on 17 March is Seachtain na Gaeilge ("Irish language week").

Since 2010, famous landmarks have been lit up in green on Saint Patrick's Day as part of Tourism Ireland's "Global Greening Initiative" or "Going Green for St Patrick's Day". The Sydney Opera House and the Sky Tower in Auckland were the first landmarks to participate and since then over 300 landmarks in fifty countries across the globe have gone green for Saint Patrick's Day.

Christians may also attend church services, and the Lenten restrictions on eating and drinking alcohol are lifted for the day. Perhaps because of this, drinking alcohol – particularly Irish whiskey, beer, or cider – has become an integral part of the celebrations. In Ireland, this relaxation of fasting rules is notably marked by the consumption of stout, a dark ale beer that is a key part of the celebration, with breweries preparing months in advance for the demand. The Saint Patrick's Day custom of "drowning the shamrock" or "wetting the shamrock" was historically popular. At the end of the celebrations, especially in Ireland, a shamrock is put into the bottom of a cup, which is then filled with whiskey, beer, or cider. It is then drunk as a toast to Saint Patrick, Ireland, or those present. The shamrock would either be swallowed with the drink or taken out and tossed over the shoulder for good luck. Irish Government ministers travel abroad on official visits to various countries around Saint Patrick's Day to promote Ireland.
