

Thanksgiving is a time to focus on all the things we should be thankful for in our lives and put aside for the moment, all the hardships



we endured throughout the year. A time to get together with family and friends and share good food and conversation. For many of us, the meaning of Thanksgiving usually includes feasting, four-day weekends, football games, floats, family reunions, or a forerunner to Christmas festivities. The "first Thanksgiving," however, was neither a feast nor a holiday, but a simple gathering. Following the Mayflower's arrival at Plymouth Rock on December 11, 1620, the Pilgrims suffered the lost of 46 of their original 102 colonists. With the help of 91 Indians, the remaining Pilgrims survived the bitter winter and yielded a bountiful harvest in 1621. In celebration, a traditional English harvest festival, lasting three days brought the Pilgrims and natives to unite in a "thanksgiving" observance.



#### Attention Ariana Village Residents, Your CAP Patrol Needs Your Help

The CAP program is in desperate need of new members to patrol our neighborhood, in order to assist our residents and keeping our community safe. There are morning, afternoon, evening and night-time positions available. Requirements are, that you must be a licensed driver, agree to a background check (which may take up to 60 days to be returned) and commit to a one day, Sheriff's Office training program, somewhere in Polk County. Upon completing the one day training program, you will be paired up with an experienced CAP member for a shift or two, until you are comfortable with patrolling on your own or with a partner and at that point, you can select your time slot from a list of available dates and times. All it takes, once a CAP member, is to commit to at least 2 hours per week, which can be split into two, one hour tours. Being a CAP member and patrolling the community, is also an excellent way to get around the neighborhood and meet new people or just simply greet your friends and neighbors along the way.
