NOTES FROM STATUATORY

This email was sent to the owners on October 20,2025. Dear Chris Garris & Nicole

On behalf of the residents, I am reaching out to discuss the recent lot rent increase. We understand that costs may rise over time, and we appreciate the efforts made to maintain the community. However, over the past two years, we have seen a total increase of \$105 in lot rent — a substantial amount, especially considering that the community clubhouse remains unavailable for use.

Many residents are on fixed incomes, and the continued increases are becoming increasingly difficult to manage. In the interest of fairness and cooperation, we are proposing a compromise: a \$20 increase to the current lot rent for 2026, and a cap of no more than 4% above COLA. We believe this is a reasonable middle ground that acknowledges both the financial concerns of the residents and the needs of the ownership.

We hope to resolve this matter amicably and avoid the need for legal proceedings. We remain open to discussion and confident that, with respectful communication, we can reach a solution that benefits all parties.

Thank you for your time and understanding. We look forward to your response.

We received response from Nicole and Chris as follows:

Good Afternoon,

We're aware of the challenges the HOA and residents have faced over the past couple of years without a clubhouse. We empathize with your situation and truly appreciate your flexibility and patience during this time. Please rest assured that the rent increase for 2026 will be very reasonable. While it may not be exactly as low as you'd like (\$0), we do expect it to be fair — and although we can't guarantee a specific number at this point, it's more than likely that it will start with a 1. You could let the residents know that you've successfully negotiated to avoid any substantial rent increases and will be working along side ownership on the furnishings and activities that will be provided at the new clubhouse.

TRASH AND RECYCLING

A reminder from the office regarding pickup schedules for trash and recycling:

The Recycling dumpster is emptied twice per week on Tuesdays and Fridays.

The office must call when the Trash Compactor is full – it is not on a scheduled pickup.

The Construction Dumpster cannot be transported to be emptied if the contents are over the top. If you find the dumpster full, you must take your load back home until the dumpster is available. You are not allowed to place it on the ground next to the dumpster.

Residents who violate trash policies and leave their garbage on the ground when dumpsters are full will be subject to fines.

Courtesy trash pickup on Tuesday is ONLY for residents with signed agreements at the office. Any resident who continues to leave trash out on Tuesdays will be in violation of the park rules . Interview with Pastor Dennis & Susan (Susie) Waldon. Susie lived in California and Dennis is from Indiana. They met in Washington where they both were working at a nuclear plant! Laughing,

There is a monthly ladies lunch, finding different places in our area to enjoy. They show Christian movies on their lanai once a month and will be showing faith-based Christmas movies starting next month. There will be a Christmas Eve service at 6:00 pm (location to be determined) They have made many good friends here and enjoy going to the planned events, wishing more participants from the community would attend. It was such a pleasure talking to Dennis and Susie. I appreciate them taking the time to talk with me.


NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

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Functions of the Homeowners Association

Every so often someone asks, "What is the purpose of the HOA and why do we need one?" so the Board thought it would be helpful to inform residents of the functions in the newsletter once each year. It is really a good thing to have for the park community.

- The first and most important function of the HOA is to represent the renters (us) with the property owner (the people we pay rent to for the land our homes sit on) using the Florida 723 laws.
 Representation includes items like rent increases, improvements or maintenance around park-owned properties and any other problems a homeowner might have with the owner/managers. The HOA can't resolve EVERY problem to the satisfaction of EVERY homeowner but without an HOA there is no one who can negotiate with the property owner (landlord).
- Second, many of the fundraising functions are also community events that help bring us all together to socialize, have fun, and meet our neighbors: dinners out together, field trips, coffee and donuts, dances, and card games. None of these would happen without an HOA to collect monies and pay bills.
- The HOA serves as an accountable body that must abide by accounting principles and be audited each
 year. This assures all of us that money collected is properly spent on community
 functions/improvements/equipment. It is also responsible for paying any taxes levied by the state of
 Florida or the IRS.
- Fourth, it is a way to gather opinions/problems/needs from the entire community and brainstorm ways to try to resolve issues.
- Fifth, this body serves as a clearinghouse to help those who are unable to fully maintain their properties on their own. Things like painting, power washing, and clean-up are coordinated with volunteers who come out to help a neighbor in need.
- Sixth, the HOA functions as a body to propose and vote on park improvements. Some examples of
 these are pool improvements (tiling, furniture, covers, and fencing), tennis-pickleball courts,
 shuffleboard courts/benches, landscaping, etc. The HOA presents items to the owner who may pay all
 or part of the desired improvements and the HOA pays for part. This gives all community members
 better facilities and a nicer place to live.
- When community members feel the park is not being maintained properly, the HOA works with the owner to persuade him to take care of the problem.
- The HOA can take legal action against the owner if things are not being maintained or rent increases are unreasonable.
- The HOA is the body that raises money and organizes (with lots of volunteer help) an end-of-year dinner and dance that is free to all HOA members and available to non-members for a small charge.
 They also help with holiday dinners where the owner contributes money, but volunteers cook, serve, and clean up.
- Many items we take for granted are supplied through the efforts of the HOA: kitchen equipment used for HOA functions park functions and private parties; comfortable card tables; pool furniture, benches; a power washer available to anyone to wash their home; a trailer for in park use and other items as they may come up.
- Finally, the HOA supports the newsletter and park directory. The publisher furnishes printing supported by advertising but much of the content is provided by the HOA.

This is not EVERYTHING the HOA does, but the Board hopes it gives the community a good idea of things the organization does, and how it improves the lives of ALL residents at Hickory Hills Manor. Remember, WE'RE IN THIS TOGETHER!!
