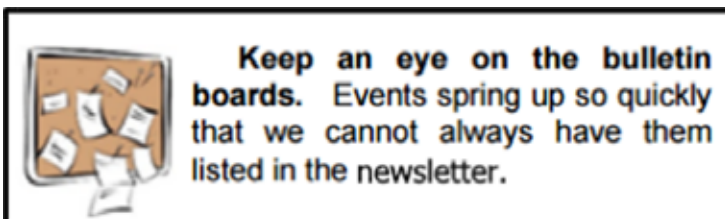

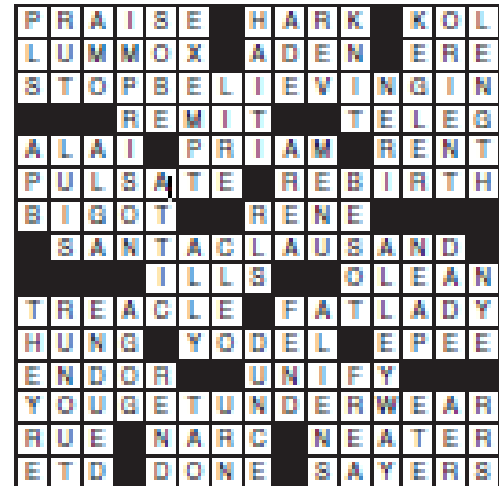

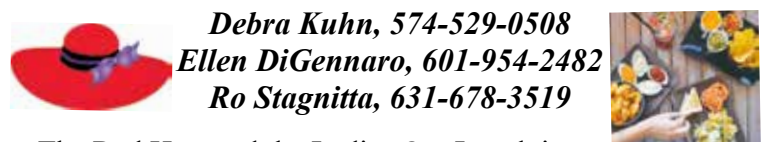
VETERANS DAY BRUNCH

Tom served in the U.S. Army from 1976-1979.



His Basic Training was at Ft. Leonard Wood, Missouri. He then served at Ft Sill, Oklahoma. Tom was a Field Artillery Surveyor. A Field Artillery Surveyor's responsibility was to ensure the weapon systems were emplaced with exact precision enabling the weapon to deliver accurate and lethal power. He also served in Germany. The one thing Tom recalls was the weather, bitterly cold.

Art served in the U.S. Army from 1965-1967 just prior to the Vietnam War. His



basic training took place in Fort Knox, Kentucky. He was then ordered to Fort Sill Oklahoma to serve in the motor pool supplying parts for trucks and jeeps. He also did the same work in Augsburg, Germany.

Art recalls two significant happenings while serving. In basic training they were given boots to wear. Unfortunately, his boots were ill fitting, and he developed blisters on his feet causing him to be hospitalized for five weeks and put in isolation at one point. The second was a NATO maneuver that airlifted them to Thessaloniki, Greece – a 600-mile road march on the trucks at 15 mph to Istanbul, Turkey.

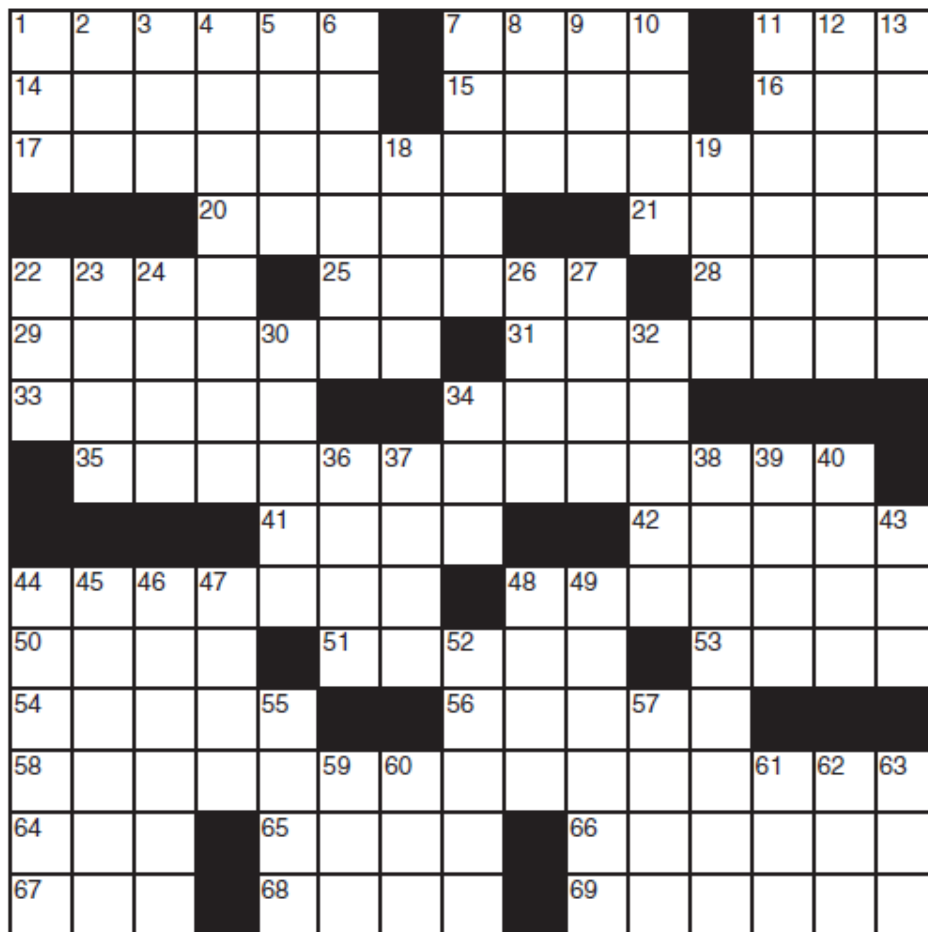

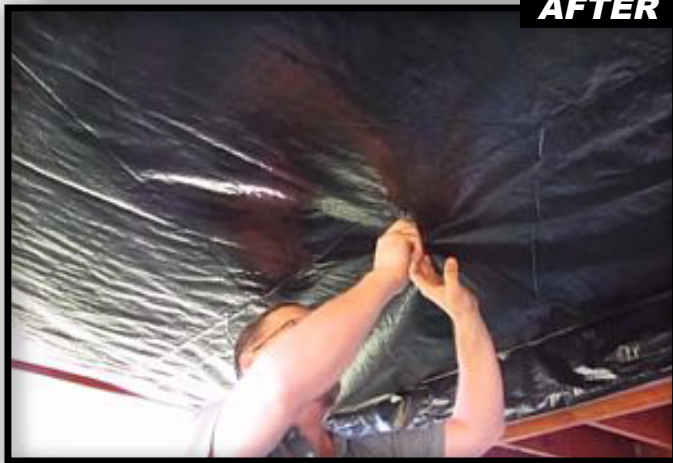
