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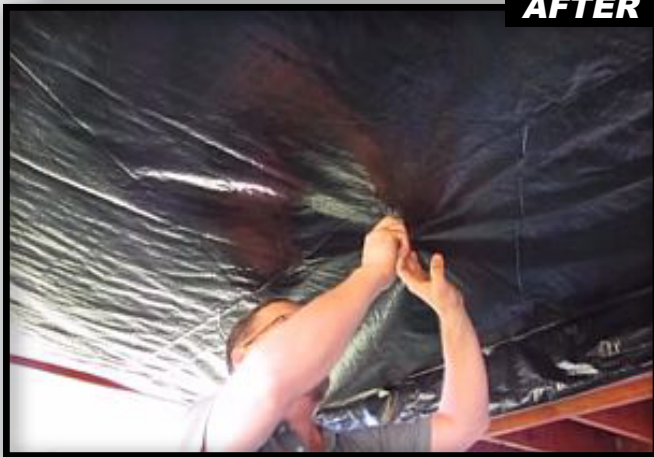
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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

So, get crafting, get baking, and get ready for a great day of shopping, socializing, and celebrating the creativity of Tropical Palms!   



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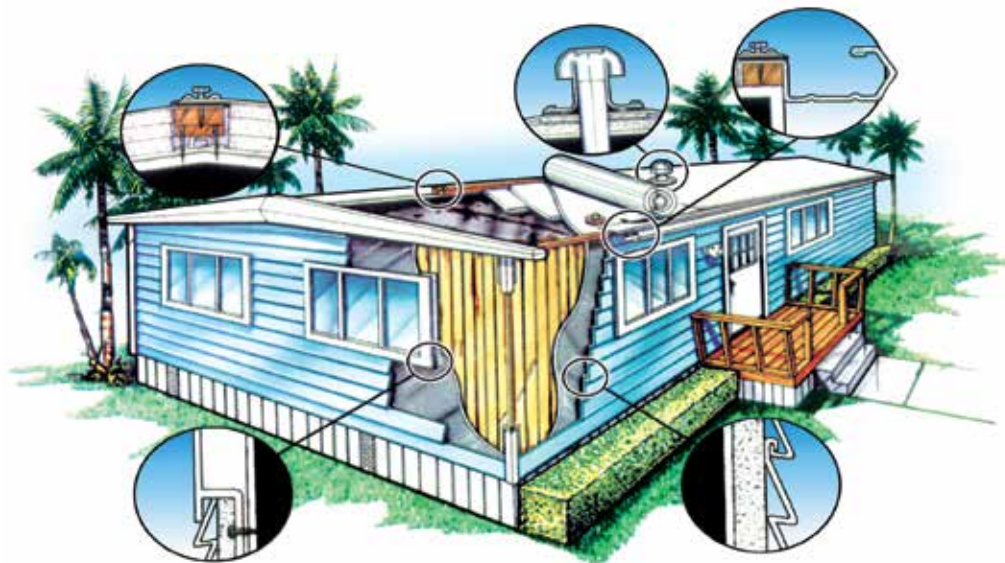
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NOVEMBER TRIVIA

- November was once the **ninth month** in the Roman calendar — its name comes from “*novem*,” meaning **nine** in Latin.

- **Elm Tree**: Representing wisdom, strength, and resilience — the elm is a reminder of endurance through changing seasons, much like November itself.
- 💎 **Topaz** is this month’s birthstone: Symbolizes love, affection, and strength. Known for its golden glow that reflects warmth and energy. **Citrine**: Represents joy, prosperity, and positive energy — sometimes called the “Sunshine Stone.”
- People born in November are statistically more likely to be **left-handed!**
- The **average daylight hours** drop quickly — most of North America loses nearly **an hour of daylight** between November 1st and 30th.
- The **smell of fallen leaves** comes from a natural chemical called *geosmin* — the same earthy scent you notice after rain!

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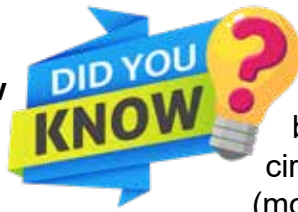
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DID YOU KNOW



Important People You Never Knew Existed but set the stage for future events that impact our civilization today.

Eratosthenes of Cyrene (c. 276 BCE – c. 194 BCE) (over 2000 years ago)

Eratosthenes was a Greek mathematician, geographer, astronomer, and poet who made significant contributions to multiple fields of science. Known as the "father of geography," he was also the first to calculate the Earth's circumference with remarkable accuracy for his time.

Here's more about his life and achievements:

Early Life and Career

- Eratosthenes was born in Cyrene (modern-day Libya).
- He studied in Athens, where he was influenced by prominent thinkers of the time.
- He later became the chief librarian at the Library of Alexandria, the most prestigious intellectual center of the western ancient world.

Major Contributions

Measurement of the Earth's Circumference

Eratosthenes is most famous for using a remarkably simple yet ingenious method to calculate Earth's circumference.

- **Concept:** He observed that on the summer solstice, sunlight fell directly into a well in Syene (modern-day Aswan, Egypt), casting no shadow. However, in Alexandria, located due north of Syene, vertical objects cast shadows at the same time.
- **Method:** By measuring the angle of the shadow in Alexandria and knowing the distance

between the two cities, he deduced that this angle represented $\frac{1}{50}$ th of a circle. A simple calculation of 50 times the distance between the two cities estimated the Earth's circumference at approximately 40,000 km (modern value is about 40,075)

SPECIAL NOTE: In the era of 200 BCE, much of the world still believed the world was FLAT!

SPECIAL NOTE 2: How did he accurately measure the 800 km distance between these two cities in 200 BCE? Not sure but worthy of further study.

Sieve of Eratosthenes

- A method for finding prime numbers up to any given limit by systematically eliminating multiples of each prime. This algorithm remains foundational in number theory and computing.

Geography and Mapping

- Eratosthenes was the first to use the term "geography."
- He created one of the earliest maps of the known world, incorporating parallels (latitude) and meridians (longitude).
- He estimated the tilt of Earth's axis with surprising precision, improving understanding of the seasons.

Astronomy

- He calculated the distance between the Earth and the Sun and attempted to measure the size of the Sun and Moon, although his values were less accurate than modern estimates.

Legacy

Eratosthenes' work laid the foundation for fields like geography, astronomy, and mathematics. His achievements demonstrated the power of observation, logic, and mathematical principles, inspiring later scholars like Ptolemy and Renaissance scientists like Copernicus and Newton.

ASK DEE



Dear Dee:

In 2025 when everyone is communicating electronically, is there such a thing as electronic communication etiquette? I feel that people do so many rude things when texting and messaging. I have a lot of trouble getting sleep, and I am a light sleeper. Yet I have a friend that will text me like at 5 am because she is awake. I have other people who will read a message but not respond. And of course there are those that will just disappear from a texting conversation without saying bye or ending it. Am I just being an old grump or this stuff just plain rude?

Dear Neighbor:

Well, I cannot answer as to whether you are an old grump or not, (lol) but I do not think that your thoughts about this are unreasonable. I do agree that sometimes people's texting behaviors can be annoying and somewhat frustrating. I wasn't sure if there was an established set of rules of etiquette for texting, so I did a little online snooping. I discovered that there is actually an Emily Post list of etiquette for texting! It includes some guidelines such as:

- Don't text to inform someone of sad news or to end a relationship. Deliver the news in person or by phone.
- Be careful when choosing a recipient from your contact list; a slip of the finger could send the text to the wrong recipient.
- When you text someone who doesn't have your number, start by stating who you are. (this is a big one for me, I have many potential patients, whom I have spoken to once on the phone weeks prior, send me random texts asking questions about their case and expecting that I know whom I am talking to!)
- If you receive a text by mistake, respond to the sender with "Sorry, wrong number."
- Don't text at the movies, a play, or a concert—the screen light is annoying to others.
- Don't text anything confidential, private, or potentially embarrassing.
- Think of texting as a conversation: If you would respond in the conversation, then respond in the text. A short "TNX" to acknowledge that the message was received is a simple way to end

the conversation.

- Don't text and drive

Part of texting etiquette is also being able to understand the abbreviations and acronyms used frequently in texting. Some of them are: IMHO – In my humble opinion, TTYL – Talk to you later, IDK – I don't know, BTW – By the way, LOL – Laugh out loud, CYA – See ya, BRB – Be right back, J/K – Just kidding,

OIC – Oh I see, THX/TNX – Thanks, L8R – Later, BFF – Best friends forever

ILY – I love you, B/C – Because. I am sure there are many others!!

In my humble opinion (IMHO), I feel that the best rule of thumb when communicating electronically, is that if it would be rude to do it in person, then it is rude to do it via text!!! L8R!!!!

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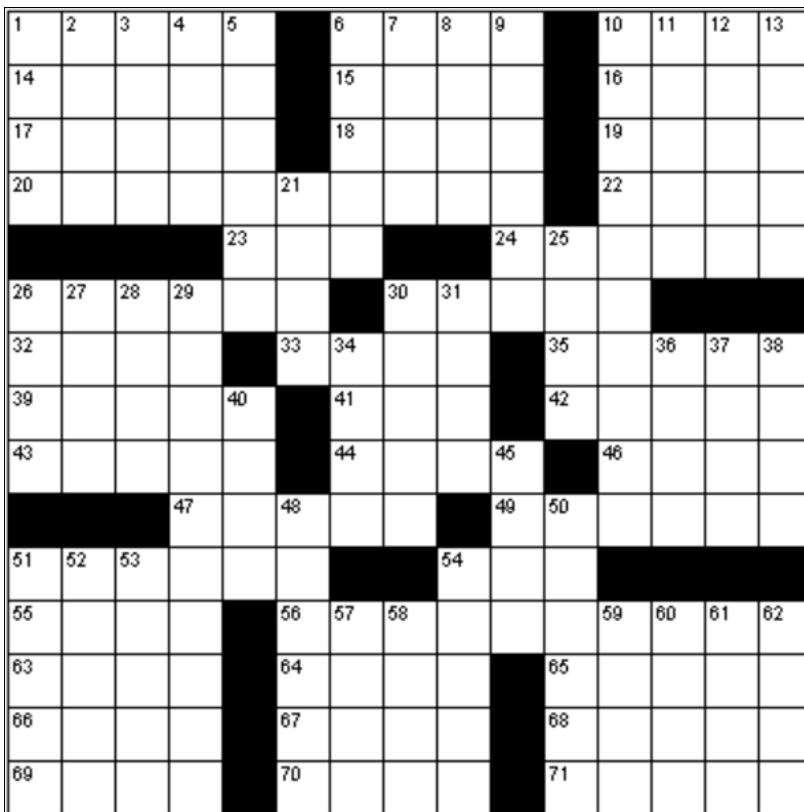

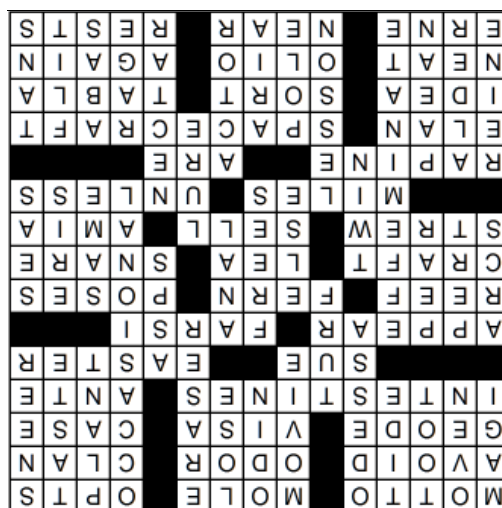
