For those of you who have not left yet, remember to fill out an emergency form at the office before you leave. If our property has a problem while we are gone, management needs to be able to get in contact with us.

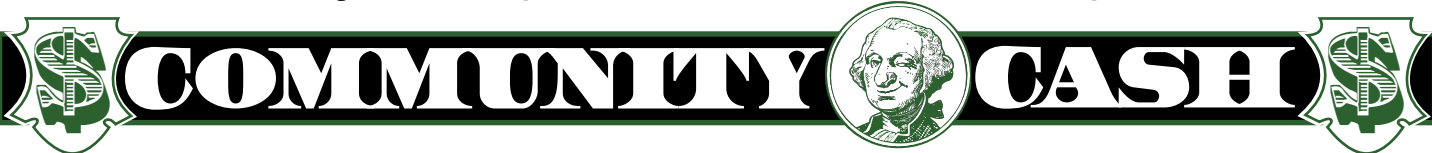

POTLUCK RECIPE OF THE MONTH – MARCH

Donna Garman treated us with her Pistachio Bar Dessert for our March potluck. It was delicious and sounds like it's easy to prepare. Thank you Donna!

Pistachio Bar Dessert

- 36 OREO Cookies, finely crushed (about 3 cups)
- 6 T butter or margarine, melted
- 2 pkgs. (3.4 oz. each) JELL-O Pistachio Flavor Instant Pudding
- 2 cups cold milk
- 1 tub (8 oz.) COOL WHIP Whipped Topping, thawed, divided
- ½ cup toffee bits

MIX cookie crumbs and butter until blended; press onto bottom of 13x9-inch pan. Refrigerate until ready to use.

BEAT pudding mixes and milk in large bowl with whisk 2 min.; spread 1 ½ cups onto crust. Stir half the COOL WHIP into remaining pudding; spread over pudding layer in pan. Cover with remaining COOL WHIP.

REFRIGERATE 4 hours or until firm. Sprinkle with toffee bits just before serving.

MARCO AND THE STORY OF SERVICE AND ASSISTANCE ANIMALS

Service animals are defined by the U.S. Justice Dept. as dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities, such as guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. The work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA); however the Fair Housing Act recognizes a broader definition of assistance animals, which includes emotional support animals. Because emotional support and service animals are not "pets," but rather are considered to be assistive aids, the law generally requires such animals to be permitted in areas where pets are prohibited, and they cannot be subjected to the size and/or weight restrictions of a pet rule.



The latest service dog to join us in Harbor Cove is Marco, a guide dog owned by Tom Hanson.



Marco is an 18-month old Golden Retriever from Leader Dogs for the Blind in Rochester Hills, MI. He spent his first year with a puppy raiser family, then the next 4 months in training at Leader Dogs. Tom and Marco then spent the next 26 days being trained together at the leader Dogs facility in Michigan. Tom returned to Harbor Cove with Marco on March 28, just in time to ride in the golf cart Easter Parade.

Because Marco's main job is to be a guide to Tom there are a few rules we have to remember to let Marco do his job. These rules apply to any service animal we may encounter in any situation.

1. Do not touch or distract the dog while it is in harness.
2. Speak to the person, not the dog.

3. Ask permission before touching the dog or making eye contact. Eye contact can distract the dog, so always interact with the person—not the dog.
4. Never offer food to the dog.
5. If the person needs assistance, he will ask for it. If it appears the person needs help, ask first, and then approach the person on the right side—the dog is usually on the left.
6. Never take hold of the dog or its harness or leash.

Marco likes to visit with everyone, so it may be hard to ignore those pleading puppy eyes when he is in harness. Feel free to stop by the house to meet or play with Marco when he's not working. He loves the attention. Welcome to Harbor Cove, Marco!

a straight and narrow road of life. In addition to this, they often become more compassionate, caring and concerned of their parents as they have families of their own.

I immediately tripped and down I went on the garage floor. Fortunately there was a rug runner at

that spot, but my head ended up inches from the car parked right there. I was stunned and my husband and daughter somewhat terrified. I could not think of moving for some time, but finally was helped to a slight sitting position on one of the steps. Finally they were able to get me into the house to our bedroom very close by. That was as far as I wanted to go. Just let me rest and eventually sleep off the agony and discomfort. Of course, there were watchful eyes on me throughout the night.

The next morning it became quite obvious I really would not recover quickly and needed some medical attention, if for no other reason than peace of mind. My husband took me to an emergency facility. Fortunately my wait was not too long, in spite of the fact it was still part of the Memorial Day weekend. I was examined and x-rayed which confirmed a pelvic fracture. I left the facility with pain medication prescriptions and a referral to an orthopedic physician. My husband wheeled me out of the examining wing and we were quickly met by two very concerned daughters and a grandson who had made the trip when they heard about my visit to ER.

Obviously, that put an end to our hope for a summer of work and fun. Although it was a lot of work for my family to take over all the household chores I had handled before. Our three daughters close by, and son in St. Louis, were all so kind, helpful, concerned, loving, and supportive throughout the next couple months of my recovery. They gave us the comfort we needed along with God's healing, to get us back on that straight and narrow path.
